Dear Spokane Veterans Homes Residents, Representatives and Family,

At the Spokane Veterans Home, 1 additional resident has been diagnosed with COVID-19 today. The resident is following our isolation protocol and all proper precautions are being taken. This makes it a total of 12 residents testing positive.

We are working closely with the Spokane Regional Health District, Centers for Disease Control, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), VA Hospital Infectious control team and our State Department of Health to ensure we are safeguarding our residents and staff.

We continue to follow the testing guidance according to Spokane Health District and the Department of Health. All staff are screened upon arrival at work each day. This process includes a series of questions around whether symptoms are present and a temperature check. In addition, staff are asked to report any symptoms that occur after coming to work.

Following the guidance from The Department of Health the following interventions will remain in place however may change if we have any additional positive residents.

Activities and Visitors

We will continue with compassionate care, window and virtual visits. We encourage everyone to contact Jeanette or Eric in Recreation Therapy at (509) 688-9209 or (509) 221-0799 to make these arrangements.

Dietary

We currently have suspended dining in the dining room; the residents will have their food delivered to their room, we will reassess after the weekend. Ancillary staff have been tasked to help assure that the meal trays are delivered timely.

Facility Maintenance

Our Housekeeping, Maintenance and Laundry departments continue to ensure that our facility, equipment and linen are kept clean and sanitized. Our housekeeping team provides continuous disinfections of all of the most commonly touched surfaces within the building along with the daily cleaning, sanitation, and repair routines that they provide.

VACCINE INFORMATION

As a part of our continued efforts to curb the spread of the COVID-19 virus, we continue to offer vaccinations and boosters for staff and residents. We encourage all residents and community members who are able and eligible to be vaccinated to consider getting vaccinated and receiving a booster for COVID-19.
