SHB 1073	Disposition of remains- Provides that a person has the first right to control the disposition of the remains of a service member who dies while in military service if the person is designated by the service member on a specified military form.	Kelley
HB 2138	Korean war veteran armistice day – Recognizes July 27 as National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day and requires that the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag be flown by public entities on that date. Specifies the third Friday in September as National POW/MIA Recognition Day.	Ormsby
SHB 2181	Washington state guard – Allows the Adjutant General to extend the age of service for members of the Washington State Guard. Extensions are for a one-year duration and may be renewed until age 68.	Dammeier
SHB 2312	Military service award emblems – Permits veterans discharged under honorable conditions and individuals serving on active duty in the United States armed forces to purchase a military service award emblem for display on license plates. Makes the following military service award emblems available: Distinguished Service Cross, Navy Cross, Air Force Cross, Silver Star medal, and Bronze Star medal.	Zeiger
ESHB 2366	Suicide assessment and treatment – Requires certain health professionals to complete training in suicide assessment, treatment, and management as part of their continuing education requirements. Requires the Secretary of Health to study evaluating the effect of training in suicide assessment, treatment, and management on the ability of health professionals to identify, treat, and manage patients with suicidal ideation. SSB 5627	Service member civil relief – Amends the Washington Service Members' Civil Relief Act to apply to National Guard members who are under a call to service authorized by the Governor for a period of more than 30 consecutive days.	Hobbs
SB 6059	Veterans' raffle – Removes provisions specifying when tickets for the veterans' raffle must go on sale and when the drawing must occur.	Conway
SB 6290	Military spouses & partners – Allows the spouse or registered domestic partner of a service member to place a license regulated by the Department of Health or the Department of Licensing on inactive status when the service member is deployed or stationed outside of the state.	Kilmer
