The Washington State Department of Veteran Affairs (WDVA) Vet Corps program is funded by AmeriCorps. Started in 2005, the program stations individuals, referred as Vet Corps members (VCMs), at colleges, universities, and community organizations throughout Washington state. The program is specifically designed to help Veterans and their family members navigate their journey as they transition from military to civilian/collegiate life. As part of the program, a Vet Corps member, typically a Veteran or a military-connected family member, provides a peer connection for Veterans to help answer specific questions or concerns they may have as they transition, and connects them to federal, state, and local Veteran benefits. Additionally, Vet Corps provides training and support to faculty, staff, administration, and community members to increase awareness of Veterans' needs.



#### **BECOMING A VET CORPS MEMBER:**

#### **VETERANS, SPOUSES AND DEPENDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE**

- · High School diploma required
- Ten-month positions start in September and end in June
- Alumni and current students encouraged to apply
- Full time (with flexibility) 1,700 hours of service required for Full-time status
- Monthly stipend and education award at program completion

#### **VET CORPS MEMBERS:**

- Provide a peer connection for Veterans new to higher education.
- Help the campus meet the needs of student Veterans by connecting them to federal, state, and local benefits.
- Connect with other Veterans on campuses and through community organizations.
- Collaborate to create a Veteran community and increase services to Veterans.
- Connect Veterans recovering from Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Post Traumatic Stress (PTS) and PTS as a result Military Sexual Trauma to services, support groups, and the larger Veteran community, while educating campus leaders and communities on Veteran issues.
