You may be eligible to receive a high school diploma

Operation Recognition

created by the Legislature, will honor those in our state who were forced to discontinue their high school education due to service in WW II, the Korean Conflict, or Vietnam.

Qualifications

- ★ Left high school before graduation to serve in World War II, the Korean Conflict, or Vietnam;
- Served in the U.S. military during World War II, the Korean Conflict, or Vietnam and were honorably discharged; and
- ★ Were scheduled to graduate from high school in the years of the war or conflict.

IF YOU HAVE A QUALIFYING FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS NOW DECEASED, YOU MAY APPLY FOR POSTHUMOUS RECOGNITION.
