Visitor Agreement

We are looking forward to welcoming family and friends of Residents back into our Homes. Please review the requirements necessary to participate in visitation. If you have any questions please refer them to the staff member assisting with your visit.

The facility will limit the number of indoor visitors within the facility depending on the capacity of the facility. Two adults and two children will be allowed at each indoor visit. The visits will be scheduled by the facility prior to the day of the visit. Indoor visitation will only be permitted for visitors or residents who are fully vaccinated. Compassionate care visits will still be permitted at all times, regardless of vaccination of either party.

Outdoor visitation remains the safest and preferred option. Unvaccinated residents can visit outdoors. There is no limit on the number of visitors that can visit outdoors other than the ability to maintain PPE/source control and 6 feet social distancing. Outdoor visit will be schedule by the facility.

Indoor visitation is not allowed if there is a current active outbreak in a facility or for residents with confirmed cases of COVID-19 or in quarantine due to exposure to the virus unless the resident is on Compassionate care visits.

NOTICE: Indoor visits will not be allowed unless the resident or visitor(s) are fully vaccinated. Fully vaccinated refers to a person who is: ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine.

Visitor criteria:

- Visitors must sign in at entrance to the facility and provide contact information.
- Visitors must be screened prior to entering the facility for signs and symptoms of COVID-19. Any items of concern for illness or exposure found during screening will result in restriction from visitation.
- Visitors must attest to COVID-19 status if known.
- Visitors will be offered COVID-19 testing at the same rate as facility staff. Visitors are not required to be tested.
- Visitors who have been vaccinated for COVID-19 must abide by all the same rules and infection control procedures.
- Visitors must acknowledge understanding of vaccination requirements for visitation.
- Visitors and Residents must wear a well fitted cloth face covering, facemask or respirator at all times that covers the mouth and nose for source control. As well as other PPE as directed during the entire visit. The door of the resident's room will be open for periodic observation of PPE/source control. PPE will be provided by the facility if needed.
- If visitors or residents are unable to wear a well fitted cloth face covering or facemask visitation must occur outdoors.
- Children are considered unvaccinated.
- Visitors must use alcohol-based hand sanitizer upon entering and exiting the facility.
- Visitors must use alcohol-based hand sanitizer or wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds upon entering and exiting the dedicated visit area/resident's room.
- Visitors must observe social distancing, maintaining at least six (6) feet of distance from others unless assisting in care. Consult the facility staff before performing any such act during a visit.
- Due to the risk of exposure, holding hands, hugging, kissing or other physical contact is not allowed during visitations of unvaccinated residents.
- Residents who have been fully vaccinated can choose to have close contact (including touch) with their visitor while wearing a well-fitting face mask and performing hand-hygiene before and after.
- Visitors must physically distance from other residents and staff in the facility.

- Visitors must stay in the resident's room or designated area.
- Visitors are responsible to ensure children less than 12 years old follow all infection control procedures.
- The risks associated with visitation were explained to the resident and their visitors so they can make an informed decision about participation. There is an increased risk of developing COVID-19 or other infectious diseases.
- Visits for residents who share a room should ideally not be conducted in the resident's room. If in-room visitation must occur, an unvaccinated roommate should not be present during the visit. If neither resident is able to leave the room, facilities should attempt to enable in-room visitation while maintaining physical distancing and source control. Roommates must agree with the visits.

Visitation Denials: We will restrict visitation if the visitor does not comply with infection control guidelines as outlined by the CDC.
