E2SHB 1134 C 454 L23	Establishes an endorsement for mobile rapid response crisis teams and community-based crisis teams that meet staffing, vehicle, and training standards, as well as a performance payment program to support them. Directs the University of Washington to develop recommendations for the creation of crisis workforce and resilience training collaboratives to offer voluntary regional trainings for personnel in the behavioral health crisis system. Directs the Department of Health to develop informational materials and a social media campaign to promote the 988 crisis hotline and related crisis lines. Establishes liability protection for several entities and personnel for activities related to the dispatching decisions of 988 crisis hotline staff and the transfer of calls between the 911 line and the 988 crisis hotline. Extends several dates related to reporting, designated 988 crisis contact center hubs, and funding the new crisis call center system platform.	Orwall

<u>SHB 1355</u> C 147 L 23	Property tax exemptions  Expands qualification for the senior citizen, disabled individuals, and qualifying veterans property tax relief program by increasing the calculation of income thresholds. Makes adjustments to income thresholds for property tax relief programs every three years. Allows individuals to continue to qualify for the senior citizen, disabled individuals, and qualifying veterans' property tax exemption if their income increases as the result of certain cost of living adjustments for tax year 2024	Wylie

2SSB 5263 C 364 L 23	Psilocybin  Establishes the Psilocybin Advisory Board (Board) within the Department of Health (DOH) to provide advice and recommendations to the DOH, the Liquor and Cannabis Board (LCB), and the Washington State Department of Agriculture (WSDA), (Board includes a military veteran or representative of a veterans organization). Creates an Interagency Work Group of the DOH, the LCB, and the WSDA to provide advice and recommendations, in regular updates, to the Board on developing a comprehensive regulatory framework for a regulated psilocybin system, and other specified topics. Requires the Health Care Authority to establish a Psilocybin Task Force (which includes includes a military veteran or representative of a veterans organization), which must provide a final report to the Governor and Legislature by December 1, 2023, on specified topics including clinical information on psilocybin use and regulatory structures for clinical psilocybin use. Grants the DOH certain duties, functions, and powers relating to studies, research, and other information regarding the safety and efficacy of using psilocybin to treat mental health conditions; rule-making authority; and other specified powers relating to psilocybin. ESSB 5320 C 95 L 23	Journey level electricians  Modifies the eligibility requirements for obtaining journey level electrician certification.  Establishes a temporary pathway for current trainees to obtain journey level electrician certification without completing an apprenticeship program through July 1, 2026. (A pathway for veterans includes having 8000 hours of experience in the electrical construction trade installing and maintaining electrical wiring and equipment while serving in a construction battalion in the armed forces.) <u>SB 5323</u> C 327 L 23	Dept. of veterans affairs  Provides an public disclosure exemption for veteran's discharge papers held by WDVA.  Moves the director of nursing services position at each state veterans' home from WMS to EMS, which is exempt from civil service provisions. Repeals statutory references to the Soldiers' Home Colony, fundraising for the eastern Washington veterans' home, and a requirement to provide domiciliary and medical care.	MacEwen
SSB 5358 C 224 L 23	Veterans' services Requires the Washington Department of Veterans Affairs to submit reports to the Legislature to determine the effectiveness of the veterans service officer program, and the veteran peer-to-peer training and support program in meeting veterans' needs. States legislative intent to increase appropriations for the programs, prioritizing smaller counties and counties with below-average rates of veterans receiving federal benefits.	Gildon
